

Monika Schröder is the author of *The Dog in the Wood* (Boyd's Mills Press, 2009), a historical fiction novel for middle grade readers set in Germany at the end of WWII. In a starred review Kirkus Reviews commented: "...this poignant look at the effects of war and propaganda, especially on children, resonates with candor and eloquence." Her second novel, *Saraswati's Way*, (Frances Foster Books/Farrar Straus Giroux, 2010), tells the story of an Indian boy who ends up as a street child in the New Delhi train station. Her third novel, *My Brother's Shadow*, takes young readers to Berlin 1918 and will be published in September 2011.
